We have a contract with PF and host hotel contracts are in process so lots of things in the works. We did things a little backwards on this as the Board approved and we proceeded with the contract without a committee. This needed to happen so we could get on the PF calendar as they only had one week available for 2024 So, for now, I am putting together a committee.

So I am soliciting volunteers from all the Midwest clubs that are in our new central zone. BMDC of Southeastern Wisconsin does fall within this geographic area. The "ask" is that you approach your club members to come onboard either as individuals or as a club. I am currently acting as show chair but my goal is to find someone who is willing to chair or act as co-chair with me. And we are in need of a Performance Chair. There are several positions that can be done "by committee" that your club may be interested in taking on. These include Ways and Means, Raffle, Trophies. We are also in need of draft chairs. Committees that can easily be managed by one person are Vendors, Parades, Photo Contest. You can find a full list of specialty positions on the BMDCA website (under the specialty tab). We do have a few positions filled but there are many more open.

There are several people in the St. Louis on board and willing to help with some of the logistic challenges presented due to distance of other committee members from the site. Purina Farms is used to working with committees remotely so this will be helpful as well as we move forward with planning.

The dates for the event are 3/31-4/6 so we are 2 1/2 years out. . .so need to get rolling to make this happen. Please get back with me with comments, suggestions, what you and/or your club would like to do. Or feel free to call should you want to chat about anything 2024 related!

Good morning SE WI BMDCA peeps,

Heart of Michigan responded to my last email with some questions and wanted clarification on how all this would work with more clubs involved. This is a bit of uncharted territory as we go from 7 Zones to 3. So we anticipate some growing pains. Buckeye also responded and asked if I would sit in on their Board meeting and I am happy to do this with them and with your club if you want. Below is my response to Heart of Michigan:

As I imagine this, we can have all clubs in the central zone work together. Or one club can take this on. But I think this is a thing of the past as we all get older and have less club volunteers involved. Ideally, the various clubs would take on certain responsibilities. So one club commit to trophies, another Ways and Means, another Raffle as these are the most time and volunteer intensive and are the most difficult to do from a distance, although possible if we can have things shipped to a central place in St. Louis. Other "big" responsibilities are draft chair, vendors. The NS committee has expanded considerably to provide support so we have peeps that do the planning booklet, solicit trophy sponsorship, do on-line and on-site registration.

Purina Farms does quite a lot of the physical work such a matting, setting rings, setting up agility equipment. We do have to get draft equipment. Chan Keith is about an hour from the site and he has agreed to be Grounds and RV chair. And there are commitments for Grooming, Welcome Bags, OB, Rally, Scentwork, Herding, Conformation, Logo development, Catalog ads, Health Clinics. Grapevine is that there is someone interested in Trophies. So some positions are filled. And the NS committee will fill in for some as well. Open positions most needed are a Chair or Co-chair (for now I am chairing and can continue but would like a co-chair), Performance Chair and Ways and Means.

The most complicating factor is how to divvy up profits if there are any. For 2021, we split based on percentage of chairs from each club. Because the Rockies did most of the work, they got most of the profits with AZ and Lone Star getting less. Everyone thought this fair so we would likely do a similar model.

Hopefully this explains things. As said, I anticipate growing pains! Do let me know if you have other questions or need clarification on how all this will work.
