An Indianapolis brewery Flat 12 Bierwerks has created a beer that's safe for dogs—and pretty darn tasty, too.

"I think every employee here owns a dog," Valerie Green of the brewery told the Indianapolis Star. "We are all very dog-friendly."

According to the Indianapolis Star, the beer is essentially a soup made from bones (donated from the meatery/smokehouse next door), vegetables, brewers yeast, and wort (which is actually used in beer brewing). To be dog-safe, it contains no alcohol or carbonation, but to maintain authenticity, it's kept in a keg.

The brewery launched the brew during an event for a local animal-welfare organization Heaven After Hell Rescue.

Pints (well bowls) sell for \$1 a pop. No price yet established for barrels.

Note that the General membership Meeting will be held Saturday, April 16th during the Spring Fling at 12:30 pm.



#### Berner-Garde Foundation: For the Love of a Berner By Brycie Marine, Berner-Garde Trustee & Co -Liaison to the BMD Repository at MSU

This column is dedicated to helping clarify and inform The Alpenhorn readers about subjects of interest pertaining to the Berner-Garde Foundation database and the Bernese Mountain Dog Repository at Michigan State University (MSU), which is a collaborative effort between the Berner-Garde Foundation and the BMDCA.

Q. Why is it so important that I update my Berner's health information in the Berner-Garde Foundation database on a yearly basis?

A. Health information is the "heart and soul" of the Berner-Garde Foundation Database. Current health information held in the database on individual dogs and their relatives helps breeders make more informed breeding decisions to produce healthier dogs. Also, having current health information in the database makes each blood, cheek DNA, and tissue sample held in the BMD Repository more valuable for use in any given research study. Not having any current medical information on any donated sample held in the BMD Repository renders the sample useless. The BMD Repository needs to know the medical background of each and every sample it holds to be able to offer the correct sample to the right research study.

Q. What kind of health information should I enter into the Berner-Garde Foundation Database?

A. All health information is important! You never know what research study might "come knocking at our door." Please include not only major illnesses for each of your Berners, but also health issues such as allergies, skin diseases, thyroid, ear infections, eye problems, tick-borne diseases, heartworm, digestion problems, chronic diarrhea, fly snapping, behavioral issues, orthopedic surgeries, skin biopsies, dental issues, etc. Whatever health issue for which you might take your dog to the Veterinarian, we would like you to include that information in your Berner's individual database page. You can and should also report good health as well. One of the most important things to record, and often the most difficult, is your Berner's date and cause of death. This information helps provide concrete data as we identify both improvements in health, but also where we might focus research efforts for newly emerging health problems in our breed.

Q. What's the best way for me to update my Berner's health information in the Berner-Garde Database?

A. It's SO Easy! Just go to the Berner-Garde website at www. berner-garde.org and proceed directly to your Berner's individual dog page in the database. Click on the "Submit Data" button, which is on the left side of the page. On the next page click on the "Individual Dog Submission Form" button. A form

will pop up that you can fill out online. If your dog is already entered into the database there is a highlighted section that will ask you to click the box. Then scroll down to the section that best fits the health information you want to enter into the database. Some information may need to be verified by your Veterinarian, but a Site Operator will let you know if further documentation is needed. That's it . . . anybody can do it in just a couple of minutes! Please consider updating all of your Berners' information today and then keep it updated on an annual basis!

#### **COULD YOUR PERSONALITY BE CAUSING YOUR DOG'S BEHAVIOR PROBLEMS?**

Bad behavior is the top reason dogs are relinquished to shelters, but what if the problem is not with the dog, but with the owner?

Researchers at the Center for Canine Behavior Studies in Bloomfield, Connecticut, are exploring the possibility that a dog's bad behavior could be caused by his owner's personality and psychological status. Dr. Nicholas Dodman, professor at Tufts University, and Dr. James Serpell, director of the Center for the Interaction of Animals and Society and a professor at University of Pennsylvania, are currently conducting the largest ever owner--dog personality study, called the Animal Ownership Interaction Study, to learn how owners may influence their pets. They hope to use the findings to ultimately improve the bond between pets and owners and discover how to better predict personality matches for people looking to acquire a dog.

The researchers cite studies that have shown that "the owners



of a sample of aggressive dogs were significantly more likely to rate themselves as tense, shy, and emotionally unstable ... than a comparable sample of owners of non-aggressive dogs." Also, research suggests, "an owner's style of interacting with a dog can have a negative influence on the animal's working ability and likelihood of displaying undesirable behaviors."

The researcher's hypothesis the following:

"Taken together, these findings suggest that the influence of owner attitudes, personality, and psychological status on the behavior of their dogs is probably mediated via their effect on the quality of the dog-owner relationship and the various interactions that comprise that relationship."

Is this really a surprise??





#### **BE PREPARED**

At this year's Specialty in Monterey, I was approached by a couple of people who had recently lost their Berners to cancer. Suddenly and unexpectedly their dogs had become ill.



They mentioned that they had wanted to submit and send frozen tissue samples from their beloved Berners to the BMD Repository at Michigan State University (MSU), but didn't know how to do that at the time when their Berners passed away. So it didn't happen. I felt sad that they could not follow through on their wishes. It would have been a wonderful, last gift from their Berners to donate samples to researchers in order to help find better treatments and possible cures for the cancers that we all too often see in our dogs.

This article is being written to help all of you if one day you suddenly find yourself with a very ill Berner, you're at the emergency clinic, you have received the heartbreaking news from your vet, and you wish to send your dog's samples to the BMD Repository at MSU.

#### Step 1.

If your veterinarian has diagnosed your Berner with cancer, have a conversation indicating that you would like to donate a fresh frozen tumor sample to the BMD Repository at MSU. Tell your vet that when it's your Berner's time s/he will need to do a simple necropsy to retrieve the sample. If your Berner has not already donated a blood sample to the Repository, you may wish to have your vet draw a blood sample at this time as well. Unfortunately, a DNA cheek swab sample will not be possible at this time as DNA cheek swabs require a special kit that a veterinarian would not have on hand at their clinic. If by chance you do have time to prepare ahead, you can obtain both the DNA cheek swab and blood kits with instructions through MSU. Information can be found on the Berner-Garde website under the Repository button or here is a direct link http://cvm.msu.edu/research/the-bernese-mountain-dog-dna -and-tissue-repository-at-michigan-state-university/shippingkits-for-samples. (Having the blood drawn and DNA cheek swab done early in life is the smart way to go. Please, if your regional club is holding a Berner-Garde Clinic or you can attend a National Specialty, that's the perfect and most economical time to collect both on your Berner.)

#### Step 2.

Go to our website at <a href="www.bernergarde.org">www.bernergarde.org</a>. The Berner-Garde (BG) website has all the contact information and instructions to make this process an easier one, not only for you, but also

for your veterinarian. If you need help during business hours, contact Marlee Richter, CVT, at the Repository. She can answer your questions and help your veterinarian with the process of harvesting the samples and shipping them back to the Repository. She is more than willing to talk to your veterinarian and their staff if they need help. If you need someone after hours you can contact me, Julie Latterell, or Lori Jodar. All of our contact numbers are on the Berner-Garde website under the Repository navigation button and printed below. We definitely recommend that you contact one of us if this is your first time donating tissue samples to the Repository. We can then make sure that the process is being done in the correct manner and that shipping the sample(s) is successful. If you cannot reach any of us and your Berner is about to be euthanized, and you want to submit tissue samples, just tell your veterinarian to do a simple necropsy within ONE HOUR of euthanasia. Your veterinarian needs to collect the tumor sample (about a 2 inch piece, if possible) (a little smaller is acceptable too) and then split it in two. DOUBLE bag one of the pieces and immediately freeze it in the vet's freezer. Ship the other piece to a diagnostic lab to determine the type of cancer. Your vet can prepare and send the diagnostic sample to the lab of his/her choice. We strongly prefer Michigan State University Diagnostic Lab Department, if possible. If you decide to donate a blood sample too, have your vet use a purple top tube with a coagulant in it and draw 6-10 ml, and place the sample in the refrigerator before euthanasia.

This is all that you need to do at that point. The next business day call Marlee at the Repository and she will help you to complete the process. The frozen sample can remain in the freezer indefinitely, so there is no hurry.

Please... On a regular basis, familiarize yourself with the BG website and the information it provides – before tragedy hits. It's always hard to try to find what you need when you are in an emotional upheaval or pressed for time. If you read the information on the BG website ahead of time, you will be more prepared and comfortable with the process of submitting samples. If your wish is to collect samples from your Berner, there is also information on the BG website that you can print and give to your veterinarian ahead of time, before your Berner becomes ill, so the process is easier for him or her.

#### Procedure to donate a sample to the BMD Repository

JUST FREEZE IT!

At the time of euthanasia let your Veterinarian know that you would like to donate a sample of your Berners cancer, to the BMD Repository at MSU.

Instruct your veterinarian to double bag and FREEZE a ½ to 1 inch sample of the tumor immediately after the necropsy. (Necropsy needs to be done immediately after euthanasia)

If you do not have a pathological diagnosis on your dogs cancer, have your vet collect a sample for that too, to be sent to a diagnostic lab,( preferably DCPAH). Store this sample in formalin.

Have your vet hold onto both of these samples until you are ready emotionally to continue the process of sending them to the diagnostic lab and the repository.

When you are ready contact Marlee(vet technician at the BMD Repository at MSU). She will guide you through the process, send you the appropriate mailing kits and talk to your veterinarian clinic personnel to ensure that you're Berners samples get to the repository safe and sound.

Please give a copy of this to your veterinarian at the time of euthanasia so they can also see the correct instructions.

#### Berner-Garde Breeder Kits - "Easy as 1, 2, 3..."

I was recently asked to participate in a pilot program to assist the Berner-Garde

Foundation (BG) in procuring DNA samples on entire litters to be stored in the Bernese Mountain Dog DNA and Tissue Repository (BMD DNA) at Michigan State University (MSU). I found the process to be easy, seamless, and <u>painless</u>. You could say it was as easy as "1, 2, 3..."

The Berner-Garde Foundation was established to assist in an effort to improve the health of Bernese Mountain Dogs. Their efforts are designed to support scientific

research into diseases and genetic conditions affecting our Berner populations. With the support of the BMDCA, Berner-Garde has established a repository of DNA and tumor tissues from Berners around the world. To date, DNA from over 2,700 Berners is being stored at MSU. In an attempt to provide multiple DNA samples from closely related dogs, a pilot program has been established. Its goal is to DNA test and submit samples on entire litters all at one time. These samples will assist researchers and their projects by providing readily available data and specimens. The newly established "Breeder Kits" allow for entire litters, rather than sporadic individuals, to have DNA samples obtained and submitted.

Here is how it works:

- When your litter of Berner puppies are born, simply contact the BMD DNA and Tissue Repository at Michigan State University. Marlee Richter, LVT, LAT, is the primary contact at <a href="mailto:berners@cvm.msu.edu">berners@cvm.msu.edu</a>. When you tell her how many puppies you have, she will provide you with a kit, which includes all of the needed supplies to submit your puppy DNA samples.
- Go to the Berner-Garde website to register the litter. Each individual puppy will be given a BG ID number.
- Contact your veterinarian to schedule an appointment. I would highly suggest doing this when the puppies are 6-8 weeks old. This is a perfect time to do physical examinations, check fecal samples for parasites, give any needed vaccinations, and obtain the 6 mls of blood to be submitted to the BMD Repository. Be sure to bring your Breeder Kit to this vet visit. The blood samples are easily obtained from the jugular vein. The amount of blood needed for DNA testing is very inconsequential for puppies at this age. Most veterinarians and veterinary technicians are more than happy to participate in such a worthwhile project. This is also a great time to microchip your pups.
- Submit the DNA blood samples in the supplied kit to the BMD Repository at Michigan State University, Attention: Marlee Richter, LVT, LAT. All the directions for submission are provided in the puppy kit. Additional information about the new owners of each puppy can be entered into

the BG database at a later time.

This is a golden opportunity to assist Berner-Garde in its efforts to improve the health and longevity of this wonderful breed. The samples collected, along with the health and pedigree information in the Berner-Garde database, will assist researchers who have been hampered in the past by a lack of samples, as well as insufficient medical and pedigree information. #### DANGER!!! Dog Restraints In Cars Fail Most Crash Tests! by Kenn Bell

While not always doing it, I think most responsible dog owners agree that it's a good idea to use dog restraints to protect your pet in case of a car accident.

Well, according to the Center for Pet Safety, a non-profit watchdog group, 25 of 29 products failed during crash tests.

"Pet owners should be screaming about this," said Center for Pet Safety CEO Lindsey Wolko. "If you get into an accident and one of these products fails, it puts you, your family members and it puts other drivers on the road at risk."
