A Dog's Best Yard from BHG April 2023

Detox Landscaping - Insecticides and fertilizers can make pets sick if they're ingested, so make sure unsafe substances aren't in areas your dog can access. Cocoa mulch is another frequent offender: if has the same compound that makes chocolate poisonous to dogs, says veterinarian Tina Wismer, senior director of the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center.

Plant Pet-Friendly - Before you bring home any greenery, make sure it's not poisonous to dogs by checking the ASPCA Poisonous Plant's database. Consider planting pet-friendly mint, lavender, rosemary, sage, basil, or oregano. And planting other scented dog-safe plants is a great way to entertain your pooch, says Nicole Ellis, certified professional dog trainer (CPDT) and pet lifestyle expert with rover.com.

Create Zones – Worried that your dog's poop or toys will get in the way of your enjoyment of the outdoors? Here are two options: you can create a potty spot and leave the rest of the yard open for play or section off a portion of the yard specifically for your dog. "If you don't want your dog peeing on the grass, consistently take him to a potty area on the side of your yard to relieve himself when he first goes outside,"

Spruce up your outdoor space with dog-friendly ideas that make hanging out in the backyard better – and safer – for you and your dog.

Ellis says. "Over time, dogs learn that's the spot for going potty."

Ward Off Digging – If your dog's digging drives you nuts, a sandpit eight be what you need. To encourage your dog to use it, Ellis recommends demonstrating to your four-legged friend by using your hands to dig in the approved area. You can also hide a tennis ball or other outdoor toy in the sand and encourage your pooch to dig for it.

Add Enrichment – Providing a variety of elements for your dog to explore is a great way to stimulate your pup's senses.

Ellis recommends tether toys that anchor into the ground, puppy playgrounds, and a sprinkler in the summertime.

Give Them Space – Ellis cautions against setting up a kennel or dog run outside, as they can become too hot or the confinement can lead to boredom; fencing in the yard is a better option. And add a window to your fence to provide endless entertainment. Your pup can peek through to see what's going on in the neighborhood.
